This team went on to win several 1st and 2nd place awards in local competitions and has also performed on national television (BET's 106th & Park), and won 1st place in the Wildin' Out Wednesdays dance competition

As a service member of CFC Youth for Christ-Maryland, MaryAnn decided to share her talent within their dance team, leading them to national conference dance championships for three consecutive years under her direction (California '04, Ohio '05, Texas '06). Now attending George Mason University, she has assisted many dance teams with choreography, including Urbanknowlogy 101 and the Filipino Cultural Association.

MaryAnn has trained with professional choreographers including Luam, Kevin Colin, and Joseph Nontanovan. She is experienced in various forms of the freestyle movement as well, including bboying, locking, and house. MaryAnn has been teaching in the DC Metro area several years and has also formed her own company, MPReyes Productions along with her own dance team, My Perfect Rhythm (directed by Zach Lattimore) which has performed in numerous DC events already.
